Adult Counselor: Job Description

Responsible to Camp Coordinator and Camp Director

Purpose:

Provide adult presence in cabins and for activities during camping program.

Qualifications:

- *18 years of age or older
- *Must have a background check on file
- *Attend counselor orientation
- *Recruited Christian adults approved by Youth and Young Adult Board
- *Sign Code of Conduct

Expectations:

- *Will meet with Camp Director prior to camp and remain after camp to clean camp site until released by Camp Director, unless other arrangements are made.
- *Will commit to a specific schedule if unable to be on campus for the entire camp
- *Unconditional positive regard for the campers
- *Respect rules and leadership of the camp

Responsibilities:

- *Oversight of the cabin
- *Help campers create their own camp experience and get most out of it they can while enriching their spiritual journey
- *Attend all staff meetings
- *Assist campers in preparation for special activities
- *Lead campers in daily devotions, clean-up and other assignments as made by the Camp Director
- *Keep track of your campers throughout the day
- *Share as much of the camper's experience as she/he invited you to share
- *Know the schedule and location of the camp's activities
- *Inform campers of the camp's guidelines and assure camper comply
- *Refer situations you cannot handle to the Camp Director
- *Be prepared to listen and share with campers
- *Report and signs of abuse or neglect to Camp Director
